From the Classroom

Curriculum

English:

In English, students will create multimodal presentation. Students will be assessed on their interaction skills through a speaking and listening task. Each student will choose an Asian country and create a presentation designed to encourage visitors to explore their chosen destination.

Mathematics:

In Mathematics, the students are learning to interpret and compare a variety of data displays including those displays for two categorical variables. Students will recognise the properties of prime, composite, square and triangular numbers and solve problems involving division and multiplication. Throughout the term students will also begin exploring the concept of fractions by locating fractions on a number line and solve problems involving the addition and subtraction of related fractions.

Science:

In Science, the students will investigate how natural events cause rapid changes to Earth's surface and how scientific knowledge helps to solve problems and inform decisions. They will construct a multimodal text to communicate their ideas, methods and findings.

Humanities and Social Sciences:

In HASS, the students are learning how places, people and cultures differ across the world. Students will choose a country from Asia and exlplain how it is globally connected to Australia. Students will also explore similarities and differences between families from their chosen country and their own family.

Technologies:

Students will apply their understanding of binary code to represent a coloured image on a digital platform. Students will practise skills using the programme code.org to create a logo and expain how digital systems use binary codes.

The Arts:

In the Arts, we welcome Mr Wills teaching Drama this term. Year 6 students will be exploring comedy; devising their own entertaining skit and performing it for an audience. Students will describe how dramatic action and meaning are communicated in their drama.

Health and Physical Education:

Students will describe the significance of physical activity to health and wellbeing, to describe their own and others contributions to safety and wellbeing. Students will develop a game and teach it to their peers as a culminating activity.

In sport Grade 6 students will undertake fitness activities such as agility, strength, speed, aerobic fitness and flexibility recording their results and comparing them to their peers.

We will also start to learn the course and do some training in preparation for the school Cross Country carnival at the end of the school term on Monday 24th March.

Japanese:

Students will use Japanese to discuss qualities of people they admire. Students will encounter authentic language in a range of spoken and written texts about a variety of imaginary characters. They will also respond to imaginative texts and identify qualities in imaginative characters. Students will understand and apply knowledge of adjectives and text features to describe attributes of imaginative characters.

Homework

This term's homework tasks will be sent out by the classroom teacher each week.

Library Borrowing

The students will attend the library once a week to borrow.

Excursions

This year our camp will be at Tyalgum Ridge Retreat. The camp will be from Wednesday 26th to Friday 28th March 2025. The camp will be focused on developing the students' skills in leadership, challenging themselves and team building. The students will be in small groups with a Year Six teacher and a camp teacher supervising. Off campus activities will have an additional staff member to ensure student safety.

Culminating Day

Please join us on Wednesday 27th March from 9:00am for our Celebration Assembly. This will be followed with our Culminating Day where we invite parents into our classrooms to see all the student work from the term.
